Dinner and an educational presentation will be followed by a genetic screening for the following nine disorders:
Bloom's syndrome; Canavan disease; Cystic fibrosis; Familial dysautonomia; Fanconi anemia, group C;
Gaucher disease, type I; Mucopolidosis type IV (ML4); Niemann-Pick disease, type A; Tay-Sachs disease

Genetic counselors and medical staff from Children's Memorial Hospital
will answer personal questions and take samples for screening.
